I- LA REACTION A UN MESSAGE LU

A- Contexte

" Ensemble, on est plus fort.", dit-on. La vie en communauté nécessite l'entraide.

B- Support

Text:

- 1- Because the situation of sick children was dreadful in the nineteenth century, a generous doctor, Charles West, rented a small house in Great Ormond Street and founded the Great Ormond Street Hospital for Sick Children in 1852. At the beginning, the hospital had only ten beds. Charles Dickens supported the hospital which he described in one of his novels "Our Mutual Friend." He raised money so that the house next door could be bought, which doubled the number of beds. Later, Queen Victoria helped too. She gave the hospital a hundred pounds, so in 1877 a new hospital was built which had a hundred and twenty beds and, in 1893, a new block was opened which doubled the number of beds again.
- 2- But the greatest benefactor was Sir James Barrie, the author of "Peter Pan." In 1929, he donated the rights of his book to the GOSH. Every time a copy of his book was sold or when the play was performed, or when a film was made, the money went to the GOSH. In 1987 the hospital needed still more money. It had grown and grown and now had a large team of specialized doctors, over six hundred nurses, and it treated eighty thousand children every year. But the building were old and overcrowded some children had to recover in the corridors after operations. Something had to be done.
- 3- It was estimated that seventy-two million pounds were needed to modernize the hospital. The government agreed to provide thirty million, but the hospital had to find the rest. A massive appeal was made on the radio, on television and in the streets. Large companies donated nine million pounds, the Scout and Girl Guide Movement raised five hundred thousand pounds; Michael Jackson gave a concert that brought in a hundred thousand pounds. The London Marathon raised an incredible one and a half million pounds. By January 1989, one year in advance, the sum of forty-two million pounds had been reached thanks to "a wonderful community effort, with thousands contributing generously of both their money and time" as the Prince and Princess of Wales said.
